The house is set up with two interview rooms, where sexually and physically abused children are interviewed and provided Direct Services when necessary. The Center is staffed with a Director, Assistant Director and a state Licensed Counselor under contract to provide counseling to child victims and non-offending parents. Medical examinations are provided primarily by CHIPS-Phone (205) 254-5199 and The Children's Hospital of Alabama. The District Attorney is the primary sponsor of the program and is President of the Executive Board consisting of various community leaders.

The Child Advocacy Center houses a multidisciplinary team which includes workers of the Department of Human Resources, law enforcement officers, counselors, an assistant district attorney, a medical director, and support personnel and child advocate volunteers. Twice weekly scheduled clinics are held in the University of South Alabama Pediatric Outpatient Clinic. Referrals are made by law enforcement officers, child protective workers of the Department of Human Resources, and physicians after reporting requirements have been met. Acute cases of child maltreatment are seen at the Child Evaluation Center at the University of South Alabama Women/Children's Hospital.

CHIPS is a multidisciplinary clinic offering outpatient medical and psychosocial evaluation services to child victims of suspected sexual abuse in a child-friendly atmosphere. The team of three physicians, three clinical counselors, and two nurses work with community professionals to assist the child through the system - from discovery to prosecution. When warranted, an Extended Assessment of Victim/Trauma Assessment may be offered for purposes of determining the extent and nature of the child's trauma, facilitating disclosure, and generating treatment recommendations. CHIPS also provides consultation and evaluation services for children admitted to Children's Hospital for possible physical abuse.

The child advocacy center is home to a multidisciplinary team approach to child abuse evaluations. There are two sound proof interview rooms equipped with two-way mirrors and audiovisual recording capabilities. Workers from the Department of Human Resources and the Juvenile Division of the Tuscaloosa County Sheriff's Department interview most of their child witnesses and/or victims at the center. The Assistant District Attorney in charge of child abuse cases has an office on site as well as the Director, her assistant, and a psychologist for evaluation and counseling. Dr. Taylor performs the medical examinations once a week in the pediatric clinic of the University of Alabama School of Medicine's multispecialty outpatient clinic. Team meetings are held every other Thursday at the center.

Comprehensive programs for physically and sexually abused children and their families are under the Programs for Children at Risk. The Team for Children at Risk (TCAR), an evidentiary team, includes physicians, nurse practitioner, part-time psychologist, and masters level social workers. The physicians and nurse practitioner perform outpatient forensic evaluations of sexually abused children. Family assessments are provided by the social workers, and all the professionals provide crisis intervention.

The TCAR also provides consultations on all hospitalized physically and sexually abused children. The Family Treatment Program provides long-term treatment of within family child sexual abuse cases. Therapy is delivered by multidisciplinary team of psychologists and social workers. The Adolescent Sexual Adjustment Project (ASAP) provides treatment for children and adolescents with sexual behavior disorders.

The S.A.R.T. Program is responsible for the medical/legal evaluation of suspected victims of child abuse, adult sexual assault and forensic examinations of the alleged perpetrators. S.A.R.T. has been in existence for over ten years and serves as a model for the coordination and implementation of medical and support services to victims of abuse and assault. The team is composed of trained MDs and RNs who share a 24 hour on-call schedule and work together with law enforcement, child protective services, rape crisis volunteers, victim/witness personnel, the district attorney's staff and the coroner's office. The services include identification, investigation, medical/legal examinations, treatment, and follow-up counseling. The examiners provide testimony in court and we work closely with the judicial process. The services are performed expeditiously with consistency, objectivity and compassion. The program is dedicated to prevent revictimization of the victims by the systems response.

The LAC and USC Violence Intervention Program is a medically-based program providing multidisciplinary interventions for all victims of child abuse and neglect, sexual assault and domestic violence. Medical services are available seven days a week, twenty-four hours a day and are conducted by professionals trained to provide appropriate diagnosis and treatment. Assessments are conducted in cooperation with the social, legal and mental health professions and coordinated with community resources and shelters for follow-up care and safe housing. The Center for the Vulnerable

Child (CVC), located at the Violence Intervention Program, is an internationally acclaimed child abuse intervention and prevention program. The CVC offers multidisciplinary medical/legal evaluations of suspected victims of child abuse with the capacity for a team approach coordinated with law enforcement, the district attorney's office and the Department of Children's Services. Follow-up medical care, crisis intervention and on-going mental health services are also offered to the children and their parents. Since this program is based in a teaching hospital, extensive training in the area of the recognition, evaluation, documentation and treatment of child sexual and physical abuse is also offered. The Sexual Assault Center Team provides quality clinical and forensic evaluations of all rape victims, regardless of age or gender. All patients are accompanied by a trained rape advocate and are provided with follow-up medical and mental health services. The Domestic Violence Center has introduced and implemented domestic violence protocols, training, treatment guidelines, a hospital hotline, medical outreach service for shelters and a specialized follow-up clinic. Victims of domestic violence and their children are currently involved in individual and group counseling at the Violence Intervention Program.

The Child Protection Center (CPC) is a critical component of the Montefiore Child Health Network, a broad-reaching, coordinated system of programs and resources focused on the needs of children in the Bronx and lower Westchester. This internationally recognized program, which is involved in child abuse diagnosis, prevention, treatment, and research, works closely with a variety of state and community agencies. Child abuse encompasses physical and emotional abuse and neglect, non-organic failure to thrive, and sexual abuse. Standardized abuse reports are not made to the abuse team, but rather to Children's Services and/or the police department. Assessments of children suspected of having been abused, or who are "at risk" for abuse are made in Teenage Clinic, Family Development Clinic or Emergency Services, depending upon the age of the child, the type of abuse, and the urgency of the assessment. Appointments are necessary for assessments in all these areas. Medical, psychosocial, and nursing assessments, with recorded and photographic documentation, is routine and involves a physician, a nurse and a social worker; however, depending on the needs of the child. Psychological, nutritional and medical specialty evaluations may also be needed. Appropriate information is transmitted to mandated agencies on standard forms. The ABC Center meets four days a week to evaluate children for alleged sexual or physical abuse. The Center is staffed by a physician, physician's assistant, and social worker. Most referrals are from regional child protection and law enforcement agencies. Evaluation consists of a brief interview followed by complete physical examination and colposcopy with photography. Videotaped forensic interviews are performed at the nearby Advocacy Center for Children of Galveston County, which also provides short-term counseling. The examination and treatment of children who may have been sexually assaulted require special services, including a facility that is comforting for a child and caring approach on the part of the staff. The Abused Children's Center at Inova Fairfax Hospital is a cooperative effort by Inova Fairfax Hospital, and law enforcement agencies. The center assists police and child protective agencies with the collection of evidence in pediatric sexual abuse cases. The center is not a walk-in or self-referral center. Children are referred only by police and child protective services. In an area that is set apart from the rest of the emergency department, the police officer or the child protective services representative interviews the victim about the events. After the interview, the SANE nurse examines the victim for injuries and collects any evidence. The SANE nurse is trained to perform a detailed forensic exam, using a physical evidence recovery kit (PERK), colposcopy imaging, performs certain medical/laboratory tests and makes any necessary referrals for follow-up care and counseling.
